So Yeon Ryu takes the win at the 5th annual tournament

GRAND RAPIDS, Mich. – The fifth annual Meijer LPGA Classic for *Simply Give* concluded today with a win by So Yeon Ryu from the Republic of Korea and a record donation of \$1.1 million to the retailer's *Simply Give* program that stocks the shelves of its food pantry partners across the Midwest.

Ultimately, So Yeon Ryu from the Republic of Korea shot 21 under par in the final round to claim the title as Meijer LPGA Classic champion.

"Well, if I look back on my season, I wasn't really satisfied with it and I've been really, really struggle," Ryu said. "...And then finally I was able to find the last piece to put everything together, so it's really, really meaningful to me."
