But as she started to fill her second cart, the panic set in until Swartz Creek Meijer Store Director Terri Greenwald came up and surprised her by paying for everything.

"At Christmastime, miracles can happen," Ferris said. "It's just a miracle, an absolute miracle. I'm very thankful for it."

In Illinois, Jennie Gatses lost everything she owned to a fire last month. So, on Saturday, the loyal Homer Glen Meijer shopper was out purchasing items – laundry baskets, utensils, towels, sheets and blankets – to replenish what she'd lost plus do a little Christmas shopping. Gatses said it was a much-appreciated Christmas surprise.

The O'Neil family was the *Very Merry Meijer* recipient in Marysville, Ohio. They spent a lot of time at the Marysville Meijer on Saturday, filling three carts with clothes, toys, electronics and shoes. They were donating everything to the Common Ground Free Store in Delaware, Ohio, which is a place where those in need can get the items they need for free. When they realized Meijer was paying for everything, they decided to donate whatever the total amount was to Common Ground Free Store on top of the items. Turns out it was \$1,595.18.

"Christmas is the time to celebrates hope, joy and kindness, and we were so excited to continue our *Very Merry Meijer* tradition and share the spirit of the season with those we hold dear: Our customers and team members," Executive Chairman Hank Meijer said.
