Capital City Market will also feature:

- An estimated 3,000 local, artisan products from brands, including Stone Circle Bakerhouse, Great Harvest, Woody's Oasis, Mr. Leslie's Cheesecake, Round Lake Produce, Blue Owl Coffee and Tantay Peruvian Cuisine
- An expansive international food aisle that will feature eight ethnic backgrounds, including Middle Eastern, kosher, Hispanic, European and Asian foods
- A Ferris coffee shop with a full functioning coffee and espresso bar
- Fresh and prepared foods, including bakery items, fresh meat and deli offerings
- An expansive beer, wine and liquor counter featuring a rolling ladder
- Basic cleaning items and health and beauty care products
- 18-foot ceilings
- Open air elements, a designed inspired by local culture in downtown's Stadium District, and six garagestyle doors with outdoor fresh produce and floral area

"The community has really embraced our small format stores because they offer a new way to bring an extensive variety of fresh and locally-sourced groceries to our customers," said Justin Stricklen, Director of Market Format Stores for Meijer. "We are excited to build on that momentum with Capital City Market and work with community partners to continue to enhance downtown Lansing."
