Registration is now open to run #forehunger during the sixth annual event

GRAND RAPIDS, Mich. - The Meijer LPGA Classic 5k Run & Walk presented by Kellogg's® will return for tournament week as an official 5k, giving runners the opportunity to use their times to qualify for other USA Track & Field (USATF) events.

The course will be measured later this spring and sanctioned by the USATF to ensure that every possible path of the course that begins and ends at Rockford High School is at least 3.1 miles long.

"We recognize this community has numerous competitive runners, and we're pleased to align our 5k in a way that helps them in future races," said Cathy Cooper, Executive Director of the Meijer LPGA Classic for *Simply Give.* "But the great thing about our race is you don't have to be a professional athlete to take part in it. It's a great way to get the entire family involved in a healthy lifestyle all while helping feed those in need."

Registration for the run and walk is now open online.

As in previous years, the race will be powered by Gazelle Sports, and will start at 8 a.m. June 15 at Rockford High School. Each participant will receive a branded T-shirt, two daily tickets to the golf tournament, valid any one day, Tuesday through Sunday, and a complimentary breakfast provided by Kellogg's after the race.

The cost to participate in the run or walk is \$25 per person, ages 18 and older, and \$15 per person, ages 17 and under. Strollers are welcome and encouraged on the course. The top three runners in each age group will receive \$500, \$250, and \$100 in Meijer gift cards, respectively.

Additionally, children ages 10 and under are invited to participate in a half-mile kid's fun run that will take place in conjunction with the 5k run and walk. The cost is \$10 per child.

Local companies, community organizations, families and schools throughout West Michigan are encouraged to put together a team of five to 10 runners to participate in the Team Challenge. The cost to participate is \$150 per team; the top five finishers in each team will be scored.

Dathan Ritzenhein, a Rockford, Mich. native and professional long-distance runner, said it's exciting the race will be USATF certified for those who are focused on the competition aspect.

"Participants will know that their times on race day are 100 percent accurate and they can attack this fast course looking for a PR (personal record)," said Ritzenhein, who placed 7th in the 2015 Boston Marathon.

The 2019 Meijer LPGA Classic will host a full field of 144 of the best women golfers for 72 holes of stroke play over four days of competition. Proceeds from the tournament – and each of the week's festivities – will once

again benefit the Meijer *Simply Give* program that stocks the shelves of food pantries across the Midwest. The 2018 tournament alone raised \$1.1 million for local food pantries through *Simply Give*. In total, the five tournaments have generated more than \$4.2 million for the Meijer *Simply Give* program.
