2019 Meijer LPGA Classic for Simply Give Raises \$1.1 Million to Feed Hungry Families

Brooke Henderson takes the win at the 6th annual tournament

GRAND RAPIDS, Mich. - Despite a slow start due to heavy rains, the sixth annual Meijer LPGA Classic for *Simply Give* concluded today with a win by Canada's Brooke Henderson and a donation commitment of \$1.1 million to the retailer's *Simply Give* program that stocks the shelves of its food pantry partners across the Midwest. Henderson was the tournament's 2017 champion.

Ultimately, Brooke Henderson shot 21 under par to claim the title as Meijer LPGA Classic champion. It's the second time she won the Meijer LPGA Classic on Father's Day.

It's always special when they're here, especially on Father's Day," said Henderson following the tournament.
